A FAITH THAT HEALS

Over the Memorial Day Weekend Robin and I and the family went to stay at an Airbnb in the Allegheny River Valley near Kennerdell, Pennsylvania. From the parsonage in Poland, it is about an hour and a half drive. One of the things I have noticed the last couple of years with arthritis in my back and right hip is that longer car rides add to the stiffness in my back and hip. When I stop and get out of the car, I find myself hunched over and lunging forward when walking. If I sit too long, I have a tougher time trying to move. Once I get moving, I feel a little better and more mobile. One day while on Robin and I and the family went to a waterfall and sat in the pool underneath it. The water was very cold but felt good on my back and right hip. While I am sitting in the cool water, I thought of the man who could not walk or move closer to the alleged healing pools at Bethesda. Jesus approaches the man at the pools and has a conversation with him. Read and reflect on the conversation in John 5:1-9 NIV, ¹ Sometime later, Jesus went up to Jerusalem for one of the Jewish festivals. ²Now there is in Jerusalem near the Sheep Gate a pool, which in Aramaic is called Bethesda^[a] and which is surrounded by five covered colonnades. ³Here a great number of disabled people used to lie—the blind, the lame, the paralyzed. ^{[4] [b] 5} One who was there had been an invalid for thirty-eight years. ⁶When Jesus saw him lying there and learned that he had been in this condition for a long time, he asked him, "Do you want to get well?"

⁷ "Sir," the invalid replied, "I have no one to help me into the pool when the water is stirred. While I am trying to get in, someone else goes down ahead of me."
⁸ Then Jesus said to him, "Get up! Pick up your mat and walk." ⁹ At once the man is cured; he picked up his mat and walked.

During the conversation, the ailing man has with Jesus he is asked a question by Jesus, "Do you want to get well"? The man had been ailing for thirty-eight years and Jesus ask him a simple but profound question that challenges the man and his desire to be healed. The gentleman response to Jesis by saying, "I have no one to help me into the pool when the water is stirred. While I am trying to get in, someone else goes down ahead of me". Jesus simply says, "Get! Pick up your mat and walk". All at once the man can get up and walk. Note that Jesus does not lay direct hands on the man or pray over him but simply tell the man to get up and to move forward in faith that Jesus's words provide healing. With just a little faith in Jesus the man finds healing. Over the last year and a half, I have collaborated with doctors and physical therapist and the doctor has told me that I will know when I need to have a complete hip replacement. With the pain I am having I have come to realize that on June 18th I will be ready to have my hip replacement and to lose the pain that I am physically having. I have appreciated all the prayers I have received from the congregations at the Canfield and Poland United Methodist Churches. The prayers and words of encouragement and love have embodied Jesus Christ grace and have echoed his healing words of love. I will be off the last two weeks of June and the first two weeks of July recovering from my hip replacement and I will be think of you all as brother and sisters in Christ that encourage myself and us all to get up and be healed and to follow Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior to bring healing to the world. Amen!
